Dear Aunt Maggie, Roy & Grace.

It was so good to get your most welcome letter you know we  
should all write to our family more. Has it been cold back there,  
it has been cold here for California, lot rain.

Well I tell you all I know about my family. My brother  
Glen and Dorothy live in Pinehurst Idaho. They have two girls  
and three boys, the two girls are married and one boy. They have  
5 grandchildren.

My sister Dorothy and Dale live in Kellogg Idaho. She has  
two girls both are married, she has 4 grandchildren.

My sister Maudie and Howard live in Spokane, Washington.  
She has a boy and girl, the girl is married but no grandchildren  
yet.

Aunt Bessie's family are all O.T.K. This is one family that we all keep in touch with. We all miss Dear Mabel so much. Her and I was just like sisters. Her husband (Floyd Tieger) is married again. His wife writes me all the time, His girl Betty Lou and son Jack are here in California, the other two girls are in Washington.

Corn Spitzer is in Moscow, Idaho and has no children.

Olive " is someplace in Washington, married, she is one that no one hear from much. But she has a girl and a boy I do know.

Copy of Clarence Caldwell's letter to his sister Myrtle Wright  
written in the spring of 1964 after the Earthquake in  
Alaska

Maud Faith Rendell Caldwell, mother of Clarence & Myrtle

Dear Myrtle & Herb

As you can see I am making carbon copies as it is so  
much easier and I can only say the same to all of you. We have  
lived thru one of the greatest and most devastating quakes ever  
recorded in the history of the world, we have also been very  
lucky as it could have been so much worse. A few hours  
earlier or at two or three o'clock in the morning it would no  
doubt have killed hundreds and hundreds of people.

I thought Florence was home but she was out by the  
garage at some friends house. Tinker and the other kids  
were home watching TV, so she took off for town after  
them and just did beat the tidal wave as she came back  
out of town. I sure did some sweating until she got  
back to the garage. I guess I did some praying too.

Everyone was trying to get out of town but couldn't  
get past the three bridges at three mile because they  
were 3 to 4 feet above the road, so all ended up at the  
Air Force rec center and gassie Lee Home.

After 7:00 and the kids got out I stood on the high way  
in front of my garage and watched all of it. Believe  
me I hope I never live to see anything like it again.  
I first saw the huge billows of smoke as Standard  
Oil tanks began to burst and explode, then I looked  
at the bay and it was going dry, there was a huge  
crack all the way across it, when the crack closed  
there was a solid wall of water at least 50 feet high  
and as it came in toward head of bay I saw the  
warehouses on the waterfront go sliding off the beach,  
I looked over toward the railroad where there was a  
switch engine and probably 30 or 40 cars and all of a  
sudden they almost disappear.

The first wave hit the beach and went back out,  
but the 2nd, 3rd which they estimated at 37 feet above  
low water was now a sea of fire as the Texaco tanks,

(just 2 short blocks from our home) started to burst, it is hard to believe what I saw, standing there on the highway as a steady stream of cars went flying by. There was boats of all sizes, 2 huge steel barges, railroad cars of all kinds, vans, houses, house trailers, auto, piling, warehouses, oil drums and all sorts of debris. Most of these are piled up across the road from my garage, but there was 9 autos in the lagoon (which I hauled out yesterday with my wrecker) and 8 or 9 houses, I don't know how many boats, one railroad cold storage car, our radio station and portions of the docks. There is no doubt some bodies too as there is still 12 missing. Several close friends of ours.

After the waves calmed down the only thing we could see looking toward town was a wall of fire. I just knew our home was gone and I thought all of the town was on fire. We got a bulldozer to clear a road along the mountainside so jeeps could get in and out.

A friend of ours walked out about 3 o'clock in the morning and told me our house was the last one still standing on this end of town. Water had been almost up to it, there was debris around it and a crack past the corner of the house thru the end of our single garage, which knocked the end out a ways and on down thru our double garage splitting the floor and foundation in it. The only thing it hurt in the house was 3 broken water glasses and a glass dish and a few of Flo's nicknacks. There was a few bricks come off the top of the chimney.

You just can't imagine how awful it was until you see it, and I sure hope none of you ever have to go thru such a thing. There is men here who went thru World War 2 that have said they never saw such a horrible sight.

We are very fortunate we didn't lose any thing, and thank God there wasn't more lives lost.

We have moved back home, but still don't have any water. I have to haul it from the garage. The army and Corps of Engineers are here and are really cleaning things up. The highway and railroad was almost completely destroyed from here to Anchorage, so it will be quite sometime before we will be able to drive to Anchorage. There is only one building left in Portage, and the highway has just disappeared in that vicinity.

No one seems to know for sure whether they are going to rebuild the railroad and Standard oil docks and of course Texaco is waiting for them to decide. If these do not build back it will just be another ghost town. You would have a hard time finding a spot to tie up a 12 foot boat on the water front right now. We lost 2 miles of water front including the cannery south of city docks. Two 500 foot piers and warehouses, Standard Oil docks and warehouses. Alaska Railroad yards and roundhouse, Army docks and warehouses, San Juan Dock, Halibut Producers cannerys, Texaco Marina way, Texaco Dock, Well Drilling mud Plant and dock, Dry docks and small boat harbor and breakwater. There is places on the water front that used to be 50 feet deep that is now 1,000 feet.

This will give you some idea of what has happened here, but as I said before you would never believe it unless you saw it and I hope you never do. As for destruction they say if it had been condensed into one area there was more damage than an atom bomb could have caused.


